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what motivates people to dress in a manner that marks them out as different to the conventional norm is it true that with dress anything goes in our mix and match postmodern culture have easily recognizable authentic subcultures imploded in a glut of ironic revivals and stylistic fragmentation does this supposed post subcultural generation actively celebrate ephemerality transience and disposability merely casting off and trying on one alternative identity after another in an ever accelerating fashion frenzy this exciting book is a considered sociological examination of such questions by listening to the voices of the subcultural stylists themselves their subjective perceptions of their style and the ideas that lie behind them the author provides original insights into issues of subjectivity and identity situating an empirical case study within a wider consideration of postmodernism and cultural change the author rejects cultural studies perspectives that attempt to read subcultures as texts drawing on extensive interviews with people who dress in what might be deemed a stylistically unconventional manner he seeks instead to establish

whether contemporary subcultures display modern or postmodern sensibilities and forms he argues persuasively that they do both a stress on postmodern hyperindividualism fluidity and fragmentation runs alongside a modernist emphasis on authenticity and underlying essence he concludes that a romantic libertarianism has permeated working class culture and that the distinction between individualistic middle class countercultures and collectivist working class subcultures has been over emphasized bloomsbury publishing

this book explores the postmodernist representation of reality and argues that historiographic metafictional texts such as peter ackroyd s chatterton 1987 are hetero referential in their creation of a heterocosm as opposed to representational and anti representational views of art it argues that postmodernist historiographic metafiction is not simply self referential but hetero referential consciously revealing the paradoxes of self referentiality while simultaneously creating a heterocosmic world where the text is capable of referring to an external reality the book highlights chatterton s narrative strategies and techniques which result in revealing the text s meaning granting process the novel acknowledges the existence of reality and the text s possibility of representation but contends that reality is a human construct in addition the book demonstrates that representation is possible through fictive referents and thus hetero referential

a dictionary of postmodernism presents an authoritative a z of the critical terms and central figures related to the origins and evolution of postmodernist theory and culture explores the names and ideas that have come to define the postmodern condition from baudrillard jameson and lyotard to the concepts of deconstruction meta narrative and simulation alongside less canonical topics such as dialogue and punk includes essays by the late niall lucy a leading expert in postmodernism studies and by other noted scholars who came together to complete and expand upon his last work spans a kaleidoscope of postmodernism perspectives addressing its lovers and haters its movers and shakers such as derrida its origins in modernism and semiotics and its outlook for the future features a series of brief essays rather than fixed definitions of the key ideas and arguments engaging and thought provoking this is at once a scholarly guide and enduring reference for the field

this book examines the relationship between nihilism and postmodernism in relation to the sublime and is divided into three parts history theory and praxis arguing against the simplistic division in literary criticism between nihilism and the sublime the book demonstrates that both are clearly implicated with the enlightenment postmodernism as a product of the enlightenment is therefore implicitly related to both nihilism and the sublime despite the fact that it is often characterised as either nihilistic or sublime whereas prior forms of nihilism are modernist because they seek to codify reality postmodernism creates a new formulation of nihilism postmodern nihilism that is itself sublime this is explored in relation to a broad survey of postmodern literature in two chapters the first on aesthetics and the second on ethics it offers a coherent thesis for reappraising the relationship between nihilism and the sublime and grounds this argument with frequent references to postmodern literature making it a book suitable for both researchers and those more generally interested in postmodern literature
